15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Margherita College, affiliated with Dibrugarh University, adheres to the university's curriculum. The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) curriculum was introduced in 2019, and in alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the college has adopted a four-year undergraduate program starting from the 2023-24 academic session. The college offers programs in Humanities, Social Sciences, Education, Commerce, and Sciences. In line with the new education policy, various generic elective courses and value-added courses have been incorporated into the syllabi fostering a more comprehensive academic experience. Moreover, the college provides an extensive selection of skill-based courses, as well as numerous add-on courses designed to enhance students' practical knowledge and employability, ensuring they are well-prepared for the demands of the modern workforce.

16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

With the introduction of the four-year undergraduate program, the guidelines regarding the Academic Bank of Credit issued by the affiliating university is being implemented by the institute and all the students across all disciplines have registered in the ABC portal. The records of these registrations are being systematically maintained by the Nodal Officer of the ABC Committee.

17. Skill development:

Under the CBCS Curriculum of Dibrugarh University., the college offers Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) such as Tourism Management, Basic in Elementary teaching learning, and Entrepreneurship. Moreover, NSS is introduced as a skill enhancement course which benefits the student community at large in acquainting them with skills of social service and community engagement. With the introduction of Four-year undergraduate programme in 2023, the institute offers Skill enhancement courses like Event management,

Soft Skills and Personality development, Advertisement Preparation of Print Media, ICT in Education, Soft Skills, Legal Literacy, Techniques of social research, Legislative procedures in India, Ms Excel and its Application in Business, Html and CMS Tools, Multimedia Applications and Tools. The Add-on-courses designed by the institute are also in line with the additional skill enhancement of the students and preparing them for the job interviews. The students are encouraged to participate in intercollegiate functions which also contribute towards their skill enhancement and builds up confidence in them. The college conducts regular workshops, seminars, lectures, presentations, and training programmes which aim at the skill development of its stakeholders.. The faculty members of the college are regularly encouraged to impart their lessons in ways which help the students augment their competencies..

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Margherita College follows the curriculum offered by Dibrugarh University. Since 2019, under the CBCS curriculum, and with the introduction of the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme in 2023, Modern Indian Languages (MIL) such as Assamese, Hindi, and Bengali have been made compulsory for all undergraduate students. Additionally, Honours programs in Assamese and Hindi are available. The classrooms of the college are multilingual, with English and Assamese as the primary mediums of instruction, while Hindi is also used when required. Furthermore, subjects like Value Education, Human Rights Education, "Human Rights in Comparative Perspective," and "Gandhi and the Contemporary World," among others, are included in various programmes to inculcate cultural values rooted in Indian tradition, helping students develop a value-oriented outlook. The college's central library boasts a substantial collection of literature on indigenous art, craft, theatre, languages, literatures, and culture. The Department of Anthropology supervises project work focusing on the socio-cultural beliefs and value practices of different tribes and ethnic communities in and around Margherita. The Tribal Study Centre in the college showcases the rich cultural heritage of the tribal communities. In the near future, the college plans to design and offer add-on courses centered on Indian knowledge systems. Yoga is actively promoted through regular activities. The college also celebrates International Mother Language Day and organizes programs to commemorate the birth anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore in Bengali, Silpi Divas in Assamese, and Hindi Divas. These programs aim to promote India's rich cultural heritage and instill a sense of pride and appreciation among students.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Margherita College is affiliated with Dibrugarh University, which provides the framework for curriculum design, including credits, assessment systems, and other essential aspects that the college has to follow. The institution places a strong emphasis on ensuring that students gain a comprehensive understanding of the curriculum, along with the expected outcomes and achievements. Faculty members guide students by clearly outlining course-specific outcomes through various means such as orientation programs, classroom discussions, and expert lectures. In addition to regular classroom teaching, the college offers tutorial classes and operates a mentor-mentee system, both of which prioritize outcome-based education. The institution actively uses continuous assessment methods, including unit tests, assignments, and course-related activities, to evaluate and measure students' progress. These internal assessment tools are designed to align with the desired course outcomes, ensuring that students' academic achievements are effectively monitored and supported.

20.Distance education/online education:

Margherita College is equipped with two open and distance learning centers: Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU) and the Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE), Dibrugarh University. KKHSOU offers undergraduate programs in Arts and Commerce, as well as postgraduate programs in Assamese, Education, English, History, Sociology, and Political Science. Additionally, it provides diploma courses in Human Resource Management and Tourism Management. Meanwhile, CDOE, Dibrugarh University, offers undergraduate programs in B.Com (General), B.A. (General), and B.A. (Honours) in Assamese, Economics, Political Science, and Sociology. The center also offers postgraduate programs in Assamese, Economics, Education, English, Political Science, Sociology, and Commerce. The faculty members of Margherita College are actively involved in teaching students enrolled in these centers, conducting classes on Sundays to accommodate their schedules. Regular study materials are designed and distributed to ensure students have the resources they need for successful learning. In addition to traditional teaching methods, online classes are held whenever necessary, allowing students to stay up to date with their coursework. These online sessions facilitate real-time interaction between students, teachers, and peers, making it easier for students to clarify doubts and engage with the material in an interactive manner.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The Institution has adopted policies to assess learning levels of advanced, average, and slow learners. An orientation program is conducted at the beginning of each session, familiarizing students with the institution, teaching-learning processes, and available facilities.

The institution assesses learning levels through various tools, including sessional exams, assignments, seminar presentations, Group Discussions and viva-voce exams. Centrally conducted tests and sessional exams are also administered. Counselling sessions are regularly conducted for the learners, engaging experts from various fields.

Remedial classes are provided for slow learners, and tutorial classes are also conducted. Lecture notes and course materials are also provided to slow learners. Advanced, average, and slow learners participate in capacity development and skill enhancement training programs, focusing on soft skills, language and communication, and life skills organized by the institution.

The selection of advanced and slow learners is based on their performance in the previous or appeared examinations. Special programs have been adopted to identify and support these learners:

Programs for Advanced Learners:

1. Encouragement to participate in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.
2. Opportunities to enroll in add-on courses for creativity, intelligence, and emotional quotient development.
3. Motivation for higher studies (post-graduation and other courses).
4. Felicitation of semester and subject toppers.

Programs for Slow Learners:

1. Remedial coaching.
2. Extra/tutorial classes.
3. Provision of lecture notes and course materials.
4. Frequent attendance checks, with communication to parents.
5. Regular review of academic performances (exam review meetings and analysis).

To create a student-centric learning environment, the institution combines traditional and modern teaching methods. Various student-centric approaches, such as experiential learning, participative learning, and problem-solving methodologies, are employed to enrich learning experiences.

To foster interactive and engaging classes, most teachers incorporate Audio-Visual aids, Google Classroom, and regular exposure and field visits. These initiatives encourage student participation in curricular and co-curricular activities. Talk programs, conducted by various departments, help students exhibit and refine their talents. Participative activities, including group discussions, projects, field visits, educational tours, departmental seminars, and lectures, enhance critical thinking and motivation beyond theoretical knowledge.

The college and students actively participate in these activities, both within and outside the institution. Internal examinations are carefully planned to assess student performance. Written assignments, submitted individually, help develop self-confidence and academic writing skills. Students are encouraged to present the seminar papers to develop the oratory skills. Most departments incorporate specific methods, such as field projects, presentations, and invited talks, on a regular basis.

Activities like project work, fieldwork, seminars, excursions, NSS special camps, and NCC camps, regularly conducted by the institution, inculcate participative learning and problem-solving methodologies among students.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The College has an effective Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) System, adhering to Dibrugarh University guidelines. The College conducts internal assessments through various processes, including seminars, group discussions, home assignments, and projects, with submissions required as per predetermined directives. Attendance carries a 5% weightage, and both written and oral methods are used to assess student progress and intelligence.

The Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) System carries 20% weightage. Two sessional examinations are conducted each semester, following university norms. Retests are conducted under exceptional circumstances. Internal examination marks are displayed on the respective departmental notice boards. 2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

The Grievances handling mechanism regarding internal examinations is completely transparent at Margherita College. Exam schedules for internal exams are centrally prepared and circulated by the authority well in advance. These schedules are prepared according to

the Academic Calendar issued by the University authority and communicated to the student community in advance.

All faculty members discuss the components of internal assessment and evaluation with students at the beginning of every semester, and this process continues until the completion of the program. Internal examination routines are carefully prepared. After the internal examination, evaluated scripts are shown to concerned students. Students can also report to the concerned authority regarding course progress if it is not satisfactory before the commencement of exams.

Grievances related to internal examinations are mostly resolved at the departmental level and, on occasion, by the Examination Conduction Board. Errors in marks, attendance, subjects, etc., are immediately addressed, corrected, and disposed of by the concerned department or Examination Conduction Board. Each member of the exam boards takes steps for quick disposal of student grievances. Close and continuous communication is maintained by board members for speedy disposal of queries.

In cases of internal practical tests, if students point out discrepancies, concerned teachers take immediate action to address and resolve the issues.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES**4.1 - Physical Facilities**

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The Institute offers programmes in Arts, Science and Commerce across 19 departments. It is equipped with 20 rooms, including a Language Lab, a Conference Hall, and two Auditoriums. Among these, five classrooms—comprising the Language Lab, Conference Hall, and Auditorium—are ICT-enabled, making them suitable for audio-visual presentations. The institute also has two portable projectors, which can be installed in classrooms when needed, and is actively working to equip additional classrooms with projectors. It has a central library with reading room, both for teachers and students. Support facilities include teachers' common room, departmental rooms, Students' Union Room, separate common room for girls and boys, and canteen for students and staff. It has own water-purifying installed at various corridors of the campus. The institute provides Wi-Fi facilities, and it also offers a playground for recreational activities, as well as parking spaces within the campus. Sustainable practices are prioritized, with solar-powered streetlights installed for campus illumination, contributing to the institute's green energy initiatives. Additionally, multiple fire extinguishers are placed across the campus to prevent and address any fire-related incidents and a power backup system to ensure uninterrupted services. For safety and security, the entire campus, including classrooms, is under continuous CCTV surveillance.

- **Laboratories:** The Head of the Department submits a list of required laboratory equipment to the Principal, who then discusses the needs with the Purchase Committee. After proper verification of stock, the requirements are fulfilled.
- **Sports complex:** The physical instructor takes the responsibility of safekeeping of the sports goods/materials.
- **Library:** Authorized vendors are relied upon for the maintenance of library hardware and software. The librarian, with the assistance of an outsourced technical professional, ensures that software is periodically updated and maintained.
- **Computers:** The institution continually upgrades its IT infrastructure as needed. A service provider is hired for hardware maintenance.
- **Classroom and Infrastructure facilities:** Classrooms and conference halls are painted or whitewashed annually. Maintenance of CCTV systems, biometric attendance machines, electrical works, and equipment such as the pump house and generator rooms is handled by hired services as required.
- **Campus Cleaning:** The college authority assigns various personnel to maintain cleanliness across classrooms and throughout the entire campus.
